What do Gettysburg, fly fishing, and a love of teaching have in common? Heidi Wirtner. Ms. Wirtner has been a staple in the Moniteau School District for more than two decades. At the end of this school year, we are bidding Ms. Wirtner a retirement farewell and would like to reflect on her time at Moniteau.

Ms. Wirtner began her career at Moniteau traveling between Washington Elementary and Dassa McKinney Elementary with an "Art Cart" and she will be ending at Dassa McKinney in her own well equipped room! Between these bookends is a career that has touched thousands of students, both at the elementary and high school levels.

During her tenure here at Moniteau, she has been an active member of the learning community. Ms. Wirtner and two students painted the mural on the Boyers Memorial. She participated in the sixth grade Gettysburg field trips as a reenactor and presenter; she taught rubbing lessons at the Pennsylvania Monument and she presented information on horses during the Battle of Gettysburg. Ms. Wirtner was also the set designer and painter for the backgrounds and scenery for the MHS musicals for twelve years. She is an active member of the Dassa McKinney School Wide Positive Behavior program as a core team member and has presented at the annual conference in Hershey, PA.

In addition, Ms. Wirtner is a fan of playing and coaching sports. She has played in three donkey basketball games, coached JV and Varsity volleyball, and developed the extremely popular Mat Ball game! If you've ever seen her on the basketball court during student celebration days, you know she's a talented and competitive basketball player. She's always willing to lend a hand when there are activities in the school, such as pep rally days and student celebration days.

During her career, there have been six superintendents, six principals, five assistant principals, but only one, very special,

Ms. Heidi Wirtner. We wish her well in her retirement as she expands her art business, enjoys fly fishing, and goes anywhere she wants. We hope that she continues to spread joy with annual Halloween costumes.

She will truly be missed.

WARRIOR SPRING SPORTS RECAP

Varsity Softball is off to a 3-3 start since returning from their Myrtle Beach trip, they are 3-1 in conference play. In a game against West Forest this past week Emily Staab was 4-4 with 4 doubles. Addy Williams chipped in with a homerun and a walk off single to win the game in the bottom of the 7th . In five at bats Mariska Shunk was on base three times. Senior Ashley Huffman will be having a signing day as she has committed to continue her academic and softball career at La Roche University.

Varsity Baseball is 4-4 to start their season. A home conference game against Cranberry at Pullman Park on 4/25 will take the boys to the halfway point in their season.

Girls Track has had multiple athletes qualify for districts including: Allie Pry (100m hurdles, 4X1 relay team), Alexis Kirschner (300m hurdles, 4X1 relay team), Riley Ealy (high jump), Emily Matz (300m hurdles), Annalyce Baptiste (4X1 relay team), Juliette Brown (4X1 relay team), and Sayge Brunst (4X1 relay team). Bella Hernandez placed 6th at the City of Hermitage Invitational in the Javelin.

Boys Track has had multiple athletes qualify for districts including Logan Campbell (discuss, 4x1 relay team), Ashton Grossman (pole vault, 4x1 relay team), David Martino (long jump, 100m dash, 4x1 relay team), Trent Beachem (300m hurdles), Isaiah Thompson (4x1 relay team), and Blaine Jamison (4x1 relay team).

The Junior High Volleyball teams finished their season with a combined record of 11 wins and 8 losses. The girls also finished 4th in the Redbank Tournament.

The Junior High Softball Team is 2-1 not including tournament play. In those three games Charlotte Thompson is batting .500 and Brylee Grossman has a total of 4.2 innings pitched with eight strikeouts and no runs allowed.

Junior High Baseball is undefeated (4-0) to start their season! In those four games, Kayne Scott has 4.2 innings pitched with 2 hits, 5 walks and 11 strikeouts, Weston Cook has 4 innings pitched with 2 hits, 1 walk, and 9 strikeouts, and Carson Beck has 3 innings pitched with 0 hits, 3 walks and 7 strikeouts. REGISTRATION

When you're ready to enroll your child, for any grade level, please come to our central registration location:

Be sure to bring the following documents:

- Child's original birth certificate
- Immunization records
- Two (2) proofs of residency
- Picture ID

Kindergarten Registration

Children must be 5 years old on or before September 1st of the current school year in order to register for kindergarten.

In addition to the registration documents (listed above) the Department of Health mandates that each new student complete a physical and dental exam before attending school. We will accept exams completed up to six months prior to registration.

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION:

With the end of the year nearing, we would like to ask that all families please convey any changes in transportation needs and child care arrangements going into the upcoming school year as soon as possible.

Please remember that the default stop for ALL students at the start of the year is their home address, as listed in Skyward.

Information regarding transportation updates will be conveyed to all students, parents and guardians at the end of the school year and throughout the summer months.

Harvest of the Month: Asparagus

Did you know?

- Asparagus may be green, white or purple. White asparagus is grown in the absence of sunlight.
- Asparagus requires about three years from planting to produce spears, but it lasts for about 15-20 years.
- When the body digests asparagus it releases a sulfur containing chemical into the kidneys, which results in a distinct sulfurous smell to the urine. Some people are not able to detect this smell.
- Purple asparagus turns green when cooked.
- Asparagus can grow
 inches in 24 hours.
- Asparagus cultivation began more than 2500 years ago by the ancient Greeks and Romans.
